Last week, the Wisconsin League of Conservation Voters PAC issued its final 5 endorsements, bringing the total to 71 endorsed candidates. **The good news: we only need to win 5 seats to have a pro-conservation majority in the state Assembly, and one of those 5 is Penny Bernard Schaber in your district!**

With your help, we can zero in on 9 races to ensure that, in January, we have a legislature that places a priority on clean water, clean air, open spaces, and recreational opportunities.

From the Campaign Trail...

Meet the 9 candidates endorsed by the WLCV PAC:

AD 28 (Luck/Amery)--Rep. Ann Hraychuck, a true outdoors woman who has proved her conservation creds with a 93% on her first Conservation Scorecard.

AD 34 (Eagle River)--Paul Tubbs, a former high school guidance counselor on a mission to protect northern muskie and clean up our lakes.

AD 36 (Crivitz)--Stan Gruszynski, a former Representative who is fed up with the state legislature's continued attacks on clean air, clean water, and good government. *Stan was also a former member of the WLCV Board of Directors, so you can trust that he has his conservation priorities straight!

AD 42 (Baraboo/WI Dells)--Fred Clark, a professional forester and ecologist that has the natural resources experience needed to represent a district so terribly effected by flooding.

AD 53 (Oshkosh/Waupun)--Richard Spanbauer, who has nearly 30 years of local government experience and is committed to working in Madison to find ways to protect family farms and open spaces for recreation.

AD 57 (Appleton)--Penny Bernard Schaber, a lifelong environmental activist that is working hard to get to Madison so she can make sure that the legislature puts smart transportation, water quality, and renewable energy at the top of their agenda.



AD 73 (Superior)--Nick Milroy, a fisheries biologist who will bring significant natural resource knowledge to the state legislature, including experience battling the mercury that contaminates our fish.

AD 93 (Eau Claire)--Rep. Jeff Smith, who was a WLCV volunteer like you before taking office! He earned a 93% on his first Conservation Scorecard.

SD 12 (Rhineland/Crivitz)--Jim Holperin, who brings a lifetime of experience as a former state Senator and Secretary of Tourism. Jim has what it takes to keep our Northwoods the gem that they are.
